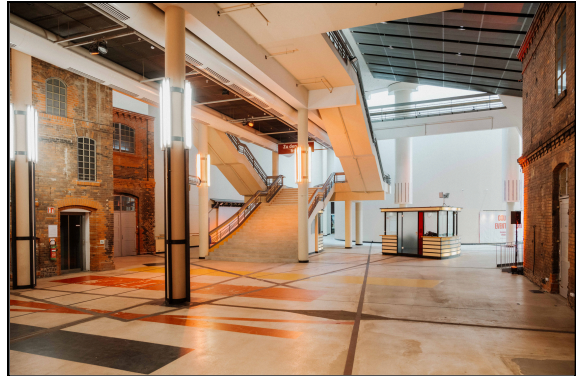


# CONGRESS VENUE

## Colosseum Berlin

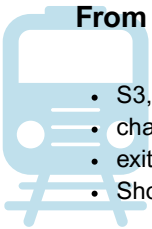

With flexible room concepts, excellent acoustics, and modern AV-equipment, the Colosseum is suitable for both large-scale events and smaller, more exclusive formats.



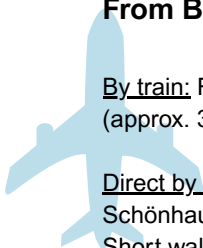
Thanks to its central location in Prenzlauer Berg and excellent connections to public transport, the venue is easily accessible – whether from the city center or directly from the airport.

### From Berlin Central Station (Hauptbahnhof):



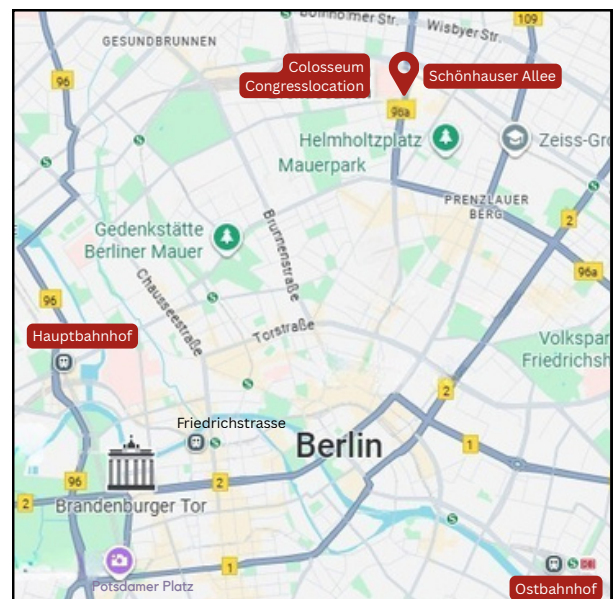
- S3, S5, S7, or S9 to Alexanderplatz
- change to U2 (direction Pankow)
- exit at Schönhauser Allee (approx. 15 min)
- Short walk to the Colosseum

### From Berlin Brandenburg Airport (BER):



By train: FEX, RE7 or RB14 to Berlin Central Station (approx. 30 min), then continue as per train.

Direct by S-Bahn: S9 (direction Spandau) to Schönhauser Allee (approx. 50 min, no transfer); Short walk to the Colosseum
