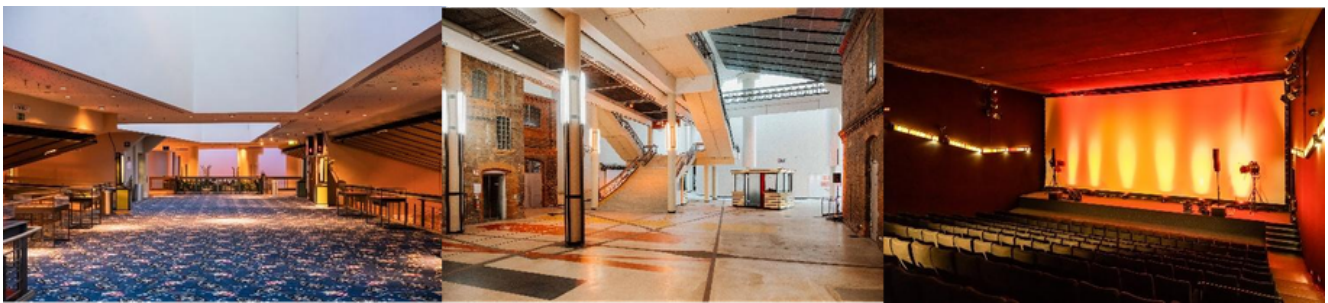

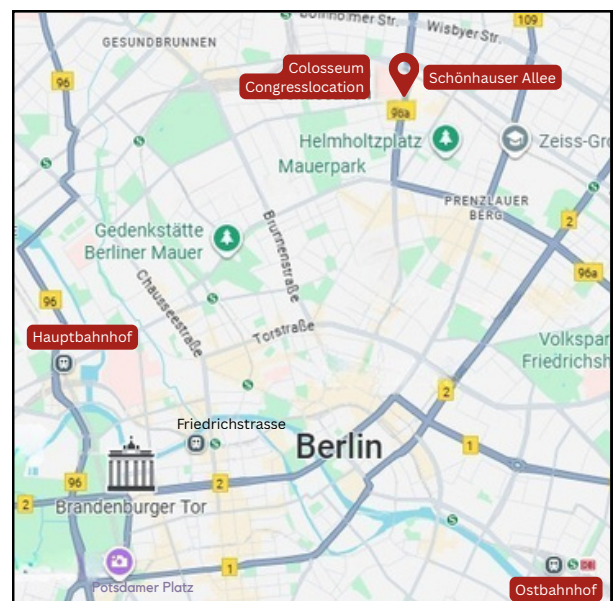

## CD30 as a Target Molecule in the Diagnosis and Therapy of Lymphomas

*Harald Stein is a German pathologist and one of the leading international experts in hematopathology. He contributed fundamentally to the development of the Kiel and REAL lymphoma classifications, which later formed the basis of the WHO lymphoma classification. His research includes the discovery of the proliferation marker Ki-67 and the CD30 receptor. Stein served for many years as Director of the Institute of Pathology at the Charité Campus Benjamin Franklin in Berlin.*

*Niels Ødum is a Professor at the Skin Immunology Research Center at the University of Copenhagen. His research focuses on inflammatory skin diseases and cutaneous T-cell lymphomas, with a particular emphasis on immune-skin interactions and disease mechanisms. He leads interdisciplinary efforts to translate molecular insights into new therapeutic strategies.*

*Angela Relógio is an internationally recognized systems biologist whose research has significantly advanced our understanding of the role of the circadian clock in human health and disease. Her work integrates mathematical modeling, bioinformatics, and experimental biology to elucidate how circadian rhythms regulate cellular processes and influence cancer development, progression, and treatment response. Professor Relógio has been a pioneer in demonstrating the complex interactions between the circadian clock, the cell cycle, and tumor biology, providing important insights into chronotherapy and personalized medicine.*

## EORTC Cutaneous Lymphoma Group: Past, Present and Future

*Rein Willemze is one of the world's leading authorities in cutaneous lymphoma and a pioneering figure whose work has fundamentally shaped the field over the past four decades. He played a central role in the development of the EORTC and WHO-EORTC classifications of primary cutaneous lymphomas, which established the international standards for diagnosis and classification of these disorders. As former Head of Dermatology at Leiden University Medical Center and a long-standing leader of the EORTC Cutaneous Lymphoma Group, he has advanced multidisciplinary research, international collaboration, and evidence-based patient care. Through his seminal contributions, Professor Willemze has a lasting global impact on the diagnosis, treatment, and scientific progress of cutaneous lymphoma.*
